UPCOMING ELECTION OF OFFICERS - New officers for the upcoming July 00 to June 01 fraternal year will be elected at the May 15th council meeting. The below Brother Knight is nominated for consideration of the corresponding office within the guidelines of the Charted Constitution Laws of the Knights of Columbus, as extracted here.

SEC. 128. All Officers, except the Financial Secretary, Lecturer and Chaplain shall be elected annually, by ballot, at a regular business meeting held between the fifteenth day of May to and including the fifteenth day of June each year, and with the exception of the Trustees who shall serve for terms not to exceed three years as provided by Section 145, said officers shall hold their offices for the term of one year from the first day of July following, and until their successors are elected and qualified. The Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight and Board of Trustees may annually select a priest to act as Chaplain, but such selection must be made in accordance with any rules established by the bishop of the diocese in which the council is located. The Grand Knight shall select annually a Lecturer. The Financial Secretary shall be appointed by the Supreme Knight.



Knights of Columbus Supreme Chaplain Bishop Thomas V. Daily of Brooklyn, New York blessed a new stainedglass window of Father Michael J. McGivney at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC last November 15th. window is in the lower sacristy of the Crypt Church of the National Shrine and was a gift from the Knights.

The National Shrine boasts similar windows of Mother Teresa, St.

Elizabeth Ann Seton and the late Cardinal John Krol of Philadelphia. The foundation stone for the crypt Church of the Shrine was blessed in 1920 and the Mass of dedication for the Great Upper Church was finally celebrated in 1959. Side altars and chapels throughout the Shrine commemorate the contributions and piety of Catholics of every ethnic heritage. Dedicated to Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, the Shrine now represents the history of Catholicism in the United States and has become, in effect, a national Church. It is both wonderful and appropriate for Father McGivney's life and ministry to be commemorated at the Shrine by the new stained glass window.

It was reported during the pilgrimage that the work is complete for the cause of Fr. McGivney canonization. The formal package is now in Rome to go through the scrutiny of the Church. Your continued prayers are need for this effort to be a success.
