JAMES H. GROVE (Sr.), member of the well-known M. J. Grove Lime Company, was born in Buckeystown District, Frederick County, December 4, 1869. He is a son of Manassas Jacob and Susan (Jarboe) Grove. (Ancestral history of family contained in sketch of William Jarboe Grove).

Jame H. Grove, son of Manassas Jacob and Susan (Jarboe) Grove, was born in Lime Kiln, Frederick County. He was educated in the public schools and Frederick City College. Since his boyhood he has been associated with the M. J. Grove Lime Company, of which his father was the founder. He is the present manager of the firm's business at Frederick. Mr. Grove is one of Frederick's best known and leading business men. The enterprise with which he is connected is one of the largest establishments of its kind in the state. Mr. Grove possesses great aptitude for business life and is very active and progressive.

Politically, Mr. Grove is a staunch Democrat. Fraternally, he is a member of Frederick Lodge, B. P. O. E. In religion. He is a member of St. John's Catholic Church of Frederick City.

Mr. Grove was married June 12, 1900, to Anna C. Forsyth, daughter of A. P. Forsyth, of Howard County, Md. There are three children by this marriage: James H., Jr., William Jarboe and Manassas Jacob.
